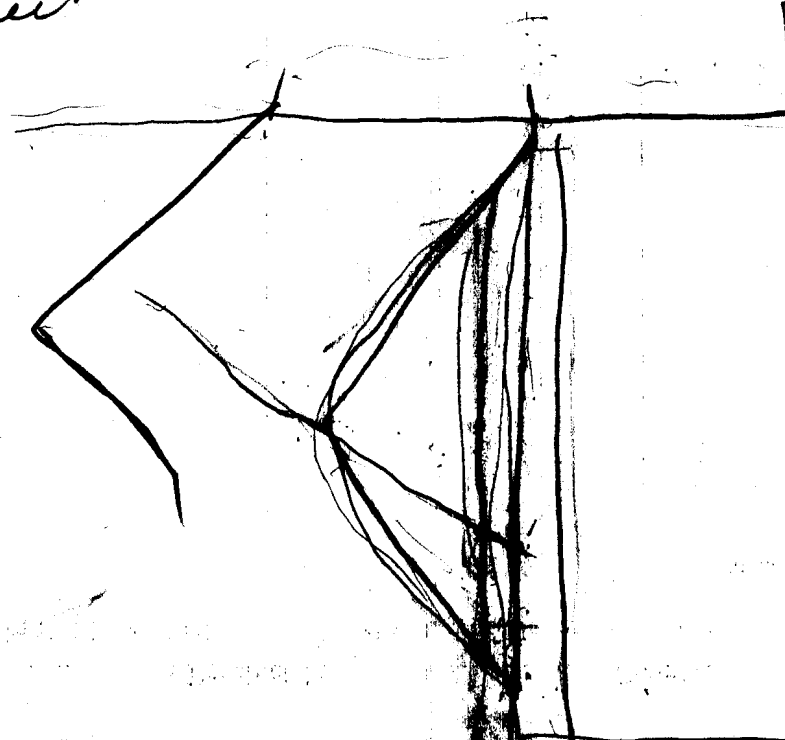

SECOND JUDICIAL DAY

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 7th, 1918

In the matter of preparing a Budget of the expenditures for the year 1919.

Now at this time it is ORDERED that the County Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and publish and submit to this Court a Budget of the expenditures for each department of County government in the manner provided by law.

In the matter of the appropriation of funds for the completion of State and Federal Post Roads.

Whereas, the Oregon State Highway Commission, The Federal Government Co-Operating, has taken over the work on the Union-Telocaset unit of the Union-Telocaset Post Road, and also on the Elgin-Minam unit of the La Grande-Joseph Post Road, undertaking to complete each project for the amount of the Engineers Estimate,

And Whereas, on account of the uncertainty of the cost of labor and material, and the uncertainty of said estimates being sufficient to complete said projects, and the completion thereof being of inestimable value to the communities in which the same are located, therefore

Be it Resolved, that Union County hereby appropriate from the General Fund of said County the amount necessary to complete said projects in the event the Engineers Estimates aforesaid are insufficient.

In the matter of the purchase of a right of way for Road purposes through the lands of T. N. Proffitt

Now at this time it appearing to the court that it is necessary to purchase a right of way for road purposes through certain lands belonging to T. N. Proffitt, and it further appearing that the said T. N. Proffitt has tendered a good and sufficient deed for the land necessary for said road,

It is therefore CONSIDERED and ORDERED that said deed be accepted and recorded in the deed records of Union County and the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant on the general fund of the County in the sum of \$132.00 in favor of the said T. N. Proffitt in payment for said land.

In the matter of the application of La Grande Real Estate Association for cancellation of an illegal assessment.

Now at this time this matter came on to be heard upon the application of the LaGrande Real Estate Association, for the cancellation of the 1916 taxes assessed against the property of Union County Fair Association, and it appearing to the Court that said property was being used for public purposes at the time said tax was levied, but through oversight, the officers of said Union County Fair Association failed to request the cancellation of said tax,
