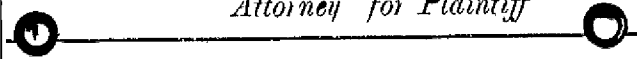

Third Judicial Day March 5th 1887

Court met pursuant to adjournment with same officers present as of yesterday.

Due proclamation of the opening of court having been made the proceedings of yesterday were read, approved and are now signed.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had to wit:

In the matter of }
✓ appropriation for }
Willow Canyon road }

Now at this time come on for hearing the petition of D. B. Reavis and other citizens of the Willow Valley praying an appropriation of one thousand dollars to be used in the completion of the Willow Canyon County road. And it appearing to the court that said road is now in an unsafe condition for the traveling public and that it would be a great hardship upon the taxpayers residing in said road district to be compelled to open and complete said road, and that justice to the taxpayers of said district demand and appropriation to be used and expended upon said road. It was ordered and adjudged that this court appropriate out of the County fund of this County the sum of \$800.00 to be applied in the working and completion of the Willow Canyon road in district No 19, Union County Or. And it is further ordered that said amount be under the supervision and expended by the present supervisor of Road district No 19 or his successor in office and that upon the certificate of said Supervisor that labor has been performed by the parties named in his said certificate, being filed with the clerk of this court he

shall issue warrants upon the County Treasurer for the amounts certified in said certificate

In the matter of the
petition of R. J. McWilliams
for liquor license

Now at this time
was presented the petition of R. J. McWilliams
and others for a license to keep and offer
for sale spirituous liquors in less quantities
than one quart in Sumnerville precinct Union Co
Oregon for a period of twelve months from the date
hereof. And also there was filed the
remonstrance of Jesse Imbles and others praying
that said license be not granted.

And it appearing that the petition is in excess
of the petition and that said petition was a
majority of the legal voters of said precinct.
And it also further appearing to the court that
due notice had been given of the pendency of
this proceeding had been given, and that
a good and sufficient bond had been
filed as by law required. It was considered
and adjudged that a license be
granted to the said R. J. McWilliams authorizing
him to keep and offer for sale spirituous liquors
in less quantities than one quart in said
Sumnerville precinct Union Co Oregon for the
period of twelve months from the date hereof.

And the said R. J. McWilliams having filed
his receipt from the Co Treasurer showing
that he had deposited the sum of \$25.00 for a
Billiard license. It was ordered that a
license be granted him allowing him to
keep for rent or hire, a Billiard table in
said Co and precinct for a period of six
months from this date.

In the matter of
the County Road through
Wallawa Canyon

It appearing to the Court that the County Road - and the Bridge on said Road - leading through Shalloway Canyon is in bad condition and that the appropriation heretofore ordered for repairs on said road, ^{and bridge} has not been expended - There yet remaining \$110.- of said appropriation - unexpended - It is therefore ordered that F. D. McCully be appointed ^{supervisor} of the expenditure of the balance of said appropriation and issue his certificates therefor - not exceeding said sum of \$110.-

In the matter of Considering
bids for Stone Abutments

Now at this time the Court proceeded to open and consider bids for stone abutments as per advertisement for same in "Mountain Sentinel" a weekly newspaper published in this County. - in an issue of said paper under date of August 5. 1882

The following bids for the abutments on Willow Creek were opened and placed on file -

H. R. Lehatten

\$396.⁰⁰

Angus Shaw

\$230.⁰⁰

Whereupon - there being no other bids and Angus Shaw being the lowest bidder it is hereby ordered that the contract be awarded to Angus Shaw for building the abutments on Willow Creek - and it is further ordered that said Angus Shaw shall enter into written contract with the County and furnish his bonds for the faithful performance of said work in the sum of \$230⁰⁰ within ten days from the date hereof.

It is further ordered that the time be extended to 16th Aug. for receiving bids for abutments on Catherine Creek - and that the Judge and Clerk of this Court be authorized to let contract on same. -

on Willow Creek - and the same is hereby ordered approved. -

In the matter of Appointment
of F. D. McCully to superintend
the expenditure of the
balance of Co. Appropriation
for Willow Canyon Road

Now at this time F. D. McCully
files his appointment in above named
road with oath of office as such supt. -
and it is ordered that the same be approved.

In the matter of
License to keep a
ferry across Snake
River -

Now at this time comes Robert
Brown and by petition duly verified asks
the Court to grant a license to said
petitioner for keeping a ferry across
Snake River - And it appearing to the
Satisfaction of the Court that said Robert
Brown is the owner of the land on both
sides of the said Snake River at a point
known as Brown's Ferry - in said County
and State. - that it is necessary that a
ferry be kept across Snake River at said
point in order to accommodate the public at
said point - that said point is the terminus
of a County Road in this County. - and also
of one in Idaho Territory - said Road being
largely traveled in going and returning from
Idaho Territory. - that Snake River is not
fordable at or near said Point - that
petitioner has lately bought said ferry
at said point of one Ed Wilkinson of Sparta
who operated the same by virtue of a license
issued from said Idaho Territory. -

Now therefore it is ordered that license
shall issue to said Robert Brown for
keeping and operating a ferry at said
Brown's ferry on Snake River - upon
his filing with the Clerk of this Court a
good and sufficient undertaking in the

sum of \$250 and paying to said clerk the amount of one year fee for such license viz. Five dollars - And it is further ordered that the rates of toll on said ferry shall be as follows, to wit:

for Wagon & two Horses	\$3.
for each additional span of horses	.50
for Loose Stock pr. Head.	.25
for Man and horse	1.00
for footman	.25

to J. D. Reed & A. Warrick

Now at this time is presented the petition of the Citizens of North ~~Grande~~ ^{La Grande} precinct praying that a license be granted to J. D. Reed and Arthur Warrick ^{authorizing in g.} them to keep and offer for sale ^{in La Grande Precinct} spirituous liquors in less quantities than one quart for the period of six months - and it appearing to the court that all due and proper notice of the pendency of these proceedings has been given according to law and no remonstrance having been filed, and a good and sufficient bond having been filed, as well the receipt of the County Treasurer, showing that the required amount has been paid into the County treasury - It is therefore ordered and adjudged that a license issue to said J. D. Reed and Arthur Warrick, authorizing them to keep and offer for sale in La Grande precinct, Union County, Oregon spirituous liquors in less quantity than one quart for the period of six months from the date hereof -
