west corner of Section Ten (10) Town 3 Range

line to range line between 45 and 46 thence north one fourth (1/4)  
mile thence east 1/2 mile on half sec. line to north W. corner of S. 1/4 of Sec. 9

In the matter of proposed  
County Road petitioned for  
by George Rivers and others.

On this day came Geo. Rivers who presents to the court the petition of himself and Twenty six others praying for the laying out and establishment of a new County Road, as follows, to wit: Beginning Eighty (80) rods north of the South west corner of Section Ten (10) Town 3 S. Range 45 East W. M. and running thence East on Quarter line to Range line between 45 & 46 thence North one fourth ( $\frac{1}{4}$ ) mile thence East two (2) miles on half Section line to N. W. corner of S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 9 Town 3 S. R. 46 E. W. M. And it satisfactorily appearing to the court from proof filed herein, that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required: that more than twelve of said petitioners are legal householders residing in the vicinity of said Road, and that a good and sufficient bond has been filed:

It is therefore ordered by the court that John Kerighton, George T. Vail and John McCull be appointed viewers, and Eugene Chase Surveyor, to view, survey and report upon said proposed County road and that they meet at the house of John Kerighton on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June 1883 at 10 o'clock A. M. and duly qualify before entering upon the discharge of their duties in this behalf.

On this day came Lemar Blanchard who presents to the court the petition of himself and forty one others, praying for the laying out and establishment of a new County Road - as follows, to wit: - Beginning at a stake marked A. on the County Road that runs through James Patterson's farm in Indian Valley Precinct Union County Oregon and thence South along the West line of Township one N of R 39 E.
