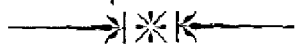

Railway thence in a South Westerly course along the Grande Ronde River and crossing said river and intersecting the present traveled road at what is known as the Hawes grade on the nearest and most practicable route from thence along the present traveled road as near as practicable to and terminating at the bridge across Grande Ronde River on the County Road in the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Sec 11 T 3 S R 36 E. W. M. All of which points and places are in Union County Oregon
