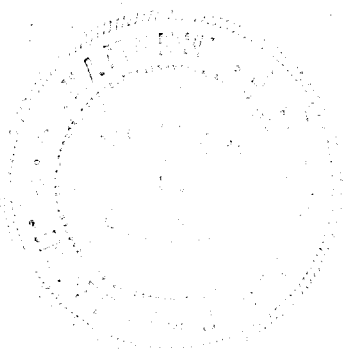

We, the undersigned viewers heretofore on the 7th day of Sept 1892, appointed to view and assess the damages claimed by School Dist No 67, Guie Meilenberg & Monroe Thorpe in the matter of the proposed county road, petitioned for by J. N. 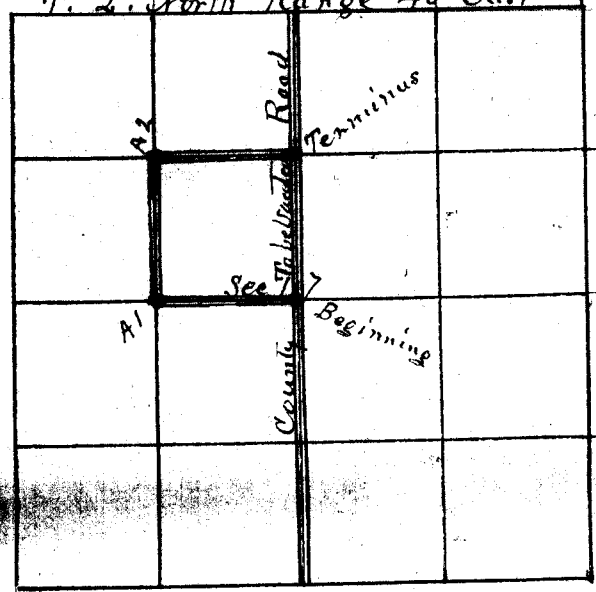
