TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT FOR UNION COUNTY, OREGON:

The undersigned viewers heretofore on the 6 day of July, 1894, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by J. M. Church, et al, beg leave to report that on the 21 day of July in the year 1894, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would greatly add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county.

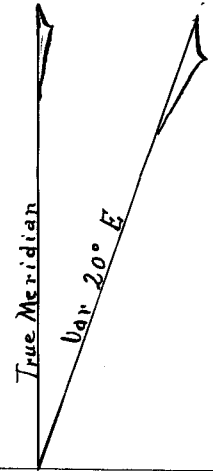
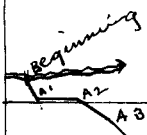

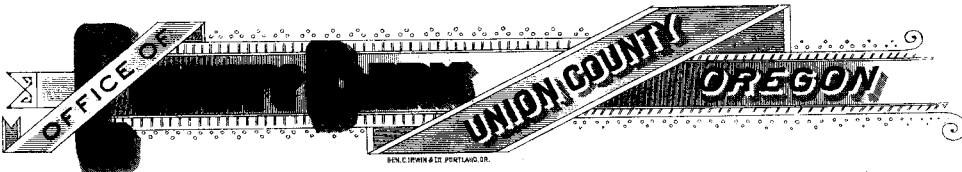

of State Taxes }

Now at this time it appearing to the Court from a statement received from the Office of the State Treasurer that there is a greater amount of State Taxes for the year 1892 charged against Union County on the books of the State Treasurer than is justly due. That the additions made to the tax roll for said year 1892 by the State board of Equalization have been charged in full against Union County when no corresponding credits have been given for the amount of such taxes or increase deducted by the Supreme Court to be erroneous and illegal. That there is a large amount of such taxes for said year 1892 that have not been collected and still remain delinquent. That there is a considerable amount of State taxes collected for the year 1893 now in the hands of the County Treasurer which should be credited to Union County on the books of the State Treasurer for the said year 1893 when paid over. Therefore the County Treasurer is hereby directed to remit to the State Treasurer all the State taxes now collected for said year 1893 or that may be hereafter collected and demand that the amounts so paid be credited to Union County on the amount due the State for the year 1893.
