It is therefore considered and ordered that the said road be declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon and ordered opened up and placed in repair for travel according to law and that Chas Heng, Jacob Heng and Dan Elledge road supervisors of road districts Nos 5, 11 and 12 respectively, the same being the road districts in which said road is located, be furnished with a copy of the petition herein and a copy of this decree and ordered to open up said road and place the same in repair for travel as soon as practicable and that all persons through whose lands said road is located have 30 days notice which notice shall be given by the said Road supervisors.
