It is therefore ORDERED by the Court, that said petition be and the same is hereby denied and the proceedings herein dismissed, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to refund to said petitioners the money already paid into Court.

And it appearing to the Court that the petitioner herein gave a good and sufficient undertaking with P.A. McDonald as surety thereon, to pay all costs and expenses incurred by reason of the view of said proposed road, in case the prayer of said petitioners be not granted,

It is therefore ORDERED and ADJUDGED by the Court that Union County have and recover of and from D. McDonald, the petitioner herein, and P.A. McDonald, his surety thereon, the sum of \$_____ and that execution issue therefor.
