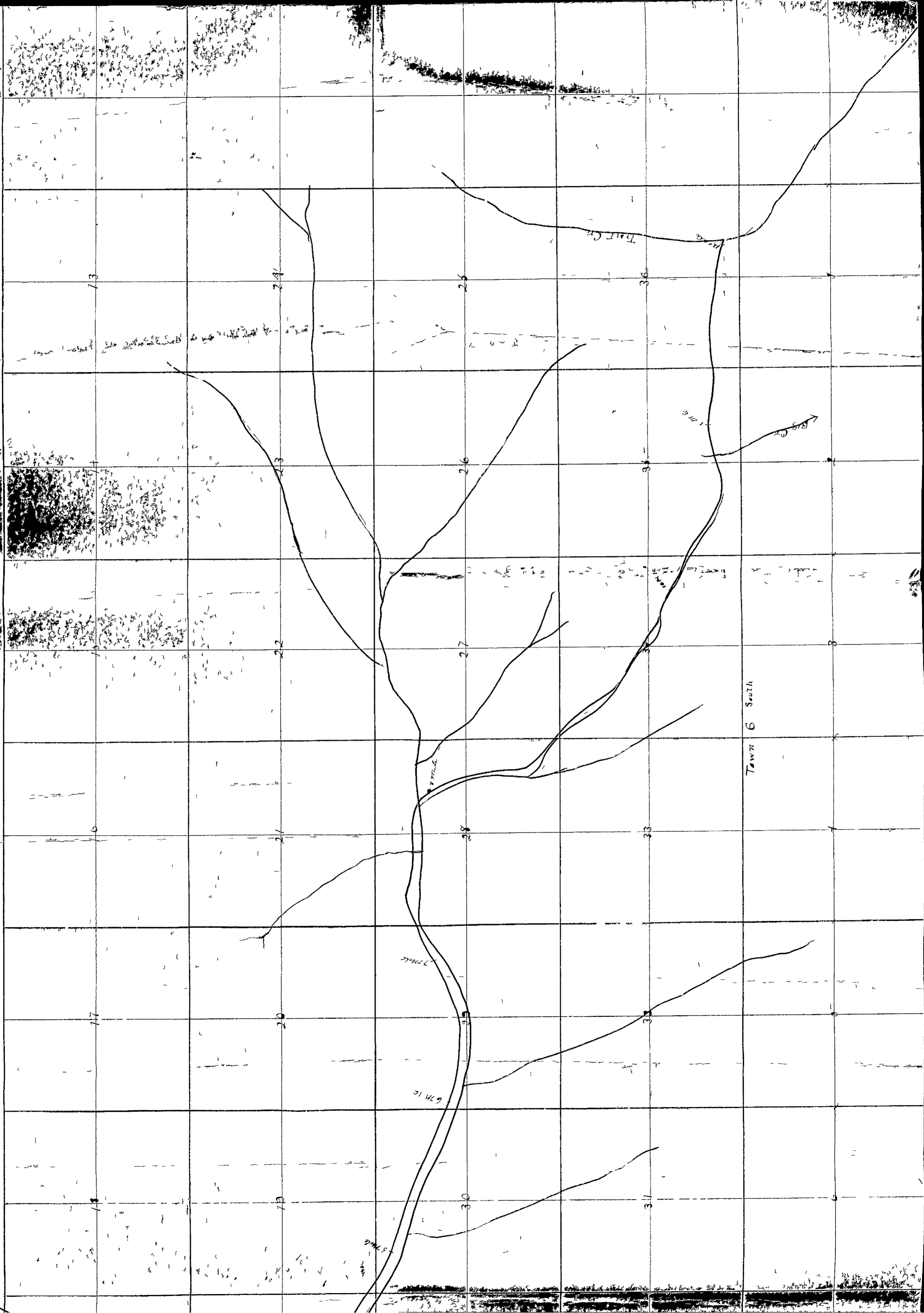

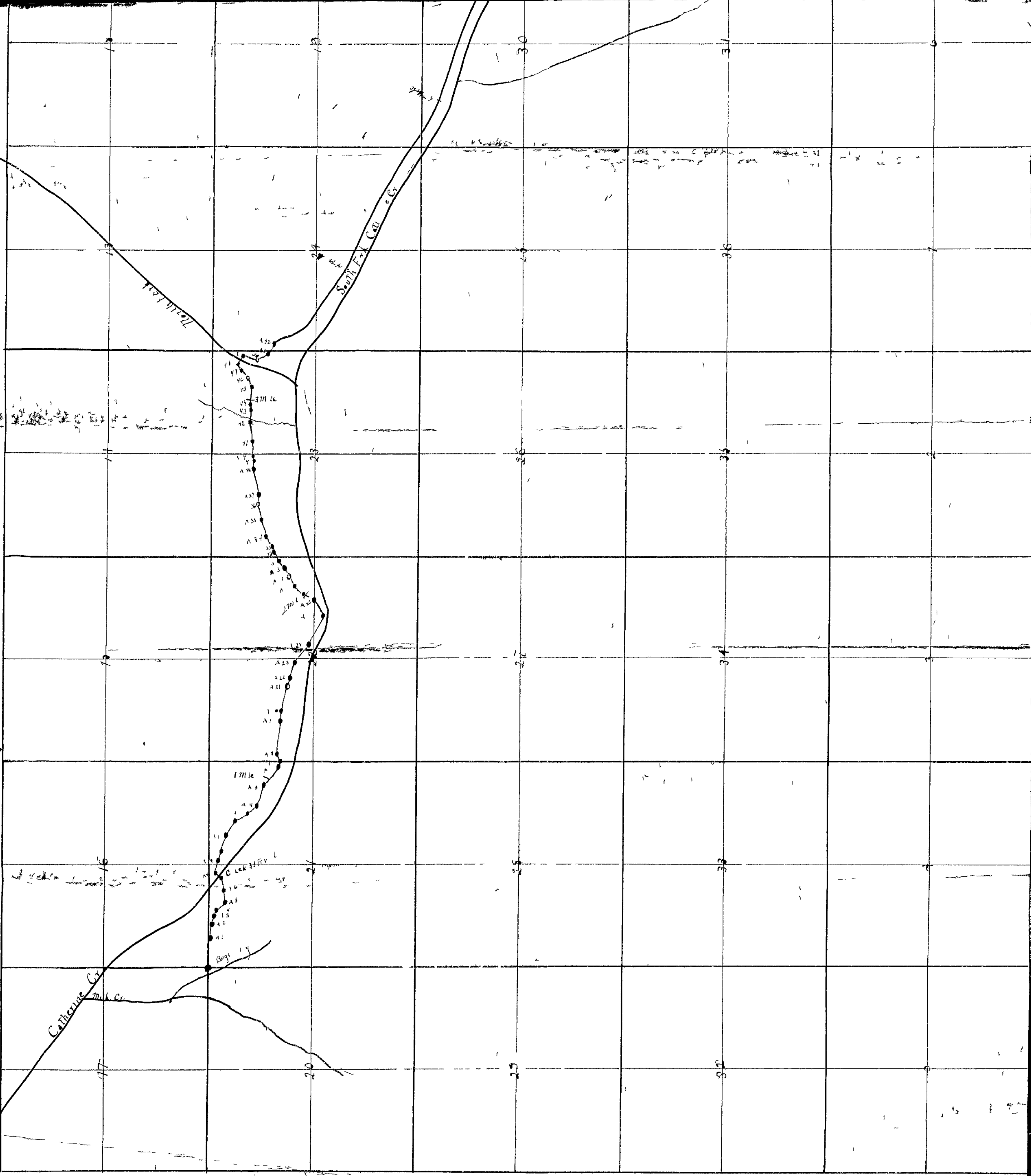

*In surveying said Road I ran the angles and marked them on the ground as far as the South Fork of Catherine Cr from there I just measured the distance and followed the North bank of creek the reason I did not run this on in angles was that we had to camp so far from work and that the brush was thick and we could not tell where we was right by the petition as it is not complete and the waters of the creek divide many times and it would take three weeks to survey it from our camp and if built it would have to be run over to set the grade.*
