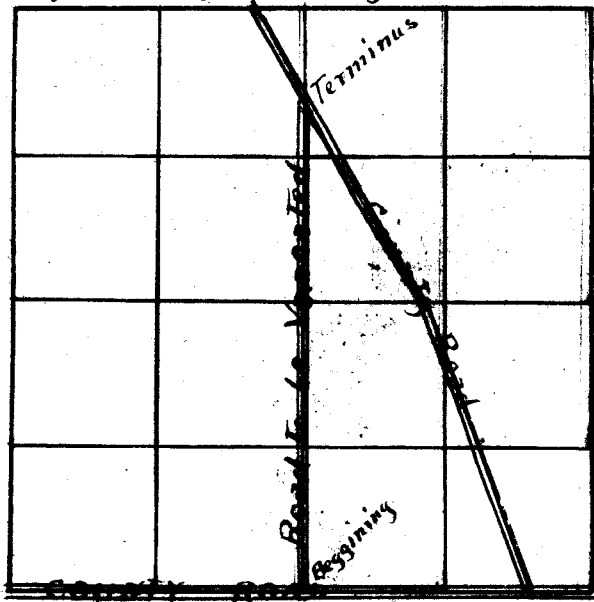

SECOND JUDICIAL DAY.

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 8th, 1910.

Sheriff of said county posted all of said notices, five in each of the twenty two precincts, at least twelve days prior to the election to be held in Union County, on the 8th day of November, 1910, to-wit: between the 15th day of October, 1910, and the 26th day of October, 1910, exclusive, and that each of said notices were posted in the vicinity of the polling place of each of the twenty two precincts, and that said County Clerk and Sheriff have entered of record their compliance with the provisions of this law contained in said Chapter 2.

That an election was held to determine whether intoxicating liquors shall be sold in Union County, Oregon, on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 1910, the same being also the General Election of this State, and at said election there were case 1158 legal votes for the prohibition of the sale of intoxicating liquors in Union County, Oregon, and 1620 legal votes against such prohibition, thereby giving a majority of 462 votes against prohibition; and that thereafter on the 12th day of November, 1910, the County Clerk of said county, taking to his assistance two Justices of the Peace of said county, made an abstract of said votes finding the aforesaid results; and it appearing that all of the provisions of the Local Option laws have been complied with in the proceedings connected with said election,

It is therefore ORDERED that there were in said election on the 8th day of November, 1910, 1158 votes cast in favor of and 1620 votes against prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors in Union County, Oregon, and that there is a majority of 462 votes against said prohibition.

It is therefore further ORDERED that the order of this court heretofore made and entered herein on the 29th day of June, A.D. 1908, declaring the result of an election held in said county and state on the 1st day of June, A.D. 1908, to determine whether the sale of intoxicating liquors should be prohibited in Union County, Oregon, be and the same is in all respects rescinded, revoked and held to be null and void from and after this date.

It is therefore CONSIDERED and ORDERED by the Court that the report of the Board of County Road Viewers be placed on record in this journal, and that the surveyor's profile and plat of the proposed road, and his field-notes of the survey thereof be placed on record in the Book of Plats of County Roads of Union County, Oregon, and that said proposed road be declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon, and ordered opened up and placed in repair for travel according to law, and that Road Supervisor of Road District No. 29, the same being the road district in which said road is located, be furnished with a copy of the petition herein, and a copy of this decree and ordered to open up said road and place the same in repair for travel, upon the payment by the petitioners the amount of the damages assessed by the Board of County Road Viewers.

In the Matter of the Proposed vacation of a county road petitioned for by A.J.Colt et al.

Comes now A.J.Colt, one of the petitioners for the above named proposed vacation of a county road, and presents to the Court the petition of himself and others, praying for the vacation of a county road, described as follows, to-wit:

SECOND JUDICIAL DAY.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 5th, 1911.

Beginning at a point 30 feet north of the southeast corner of the southwest quarter of Section 2 T. 1 S. R. 38 E.W.M. at the intersection with the county road running east and west between sections 2 and 11 in said township and extending thence north on the quarter section line through the center of said section two to the intersection with the county road from Summerville, at a point about 60 rods south of the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of said section two, said point being at the northwest corner of Asahel Colt's yard.

And it appearing to the court that said petition is signed by more than twelve freeholders of this county, residing in the road district where the hereinbefore described road is proposed to be, and that said petition properly specifies the place of beginning, intermediate points and place of termination of said road, and it satisfactorily appearing to the court that notice has been given by advertisement posted at the place of holding County Court, to-wit: At the Court House in the City of La Grande, County of Union, State of Oregon, and also in three public places in the vicinity of said proposed road, to-wit: One at the south end of the proposed closed road on a board or stake of the fence, one on a board or post at the north end of the proposed closed road, and one on a stump at the forks of the road near the Dry Creek School House, for more than thirty days immediately prior to the presentation of said petition to this Court, notifying all persons concerned that application would be made to this court, at the present session of this court, and that the notices so posted were in due form and duly signed by the petitioners, and that a bond for the costs of this proceeding has been duly given.

It is therefore ORDERED that Arthur Curtis, County Surveyor, and Thomas Brasher and E.A.Wills constituting the Board of County Road Viewers, be and they are hereby directed to meet at the A.J.Colt Farm on the 23rd day of January, 1911, at the hour of 1 o'clock P.M. or within five days thereafter and proceed to survey, view and lay out said road according to law.

Thereupon it was ORDERED that Court be now adjourned until tomorrow, January 6th, 1911, at 9 o'clock A.M.
