R. 39 E., running west about 2 miles, to where the eastern terminus of Road No. 293 is established; thence west along Road No. 293 to its starting point and where same intersects Road No. 196, the same being the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 5, Tp. 2 S. R. 39 E., that the said Roads be altered so that same shall be forty feet in width instead of sixty feet in width as now established.
