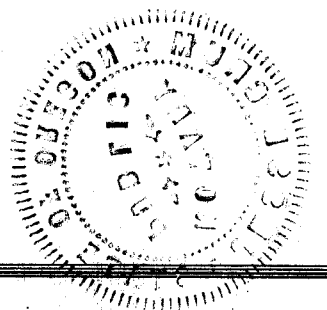

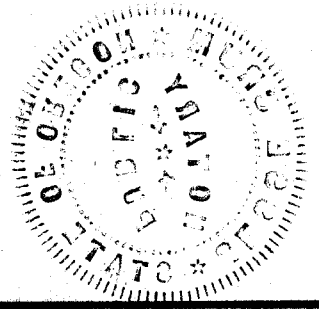



It is therefore CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that Union County enter into the following lease, and the County clerk is hereby authorized and directed to sign said lease on the part of Union County;
