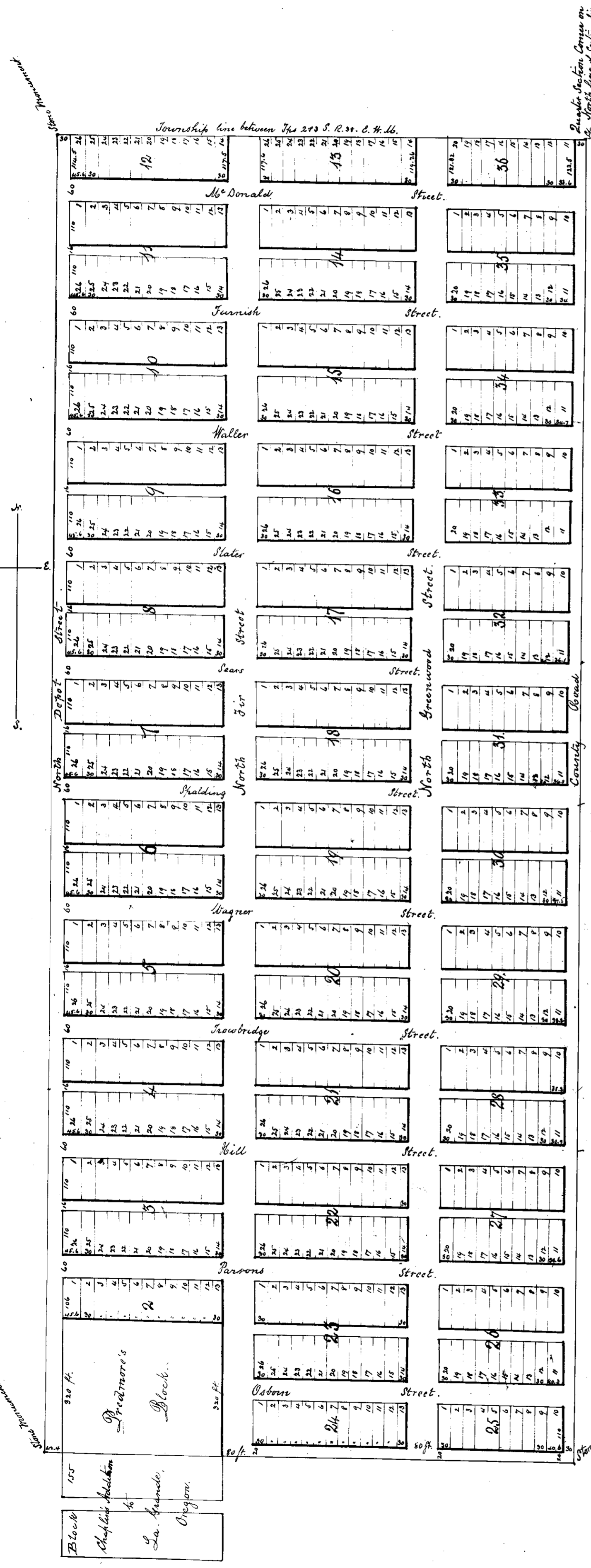


Corrected Plat

Know all Men by these Presents, that the LaGrande Land Company, a Corporation incorporated under and by virtue of the Laws of the State of Oregon, has laid out and platted Predmore Addition to the City of LaGrande, Oregon upon the following described property, to-wit: The East half of North West quarter, and North half of North East quarter of South West quarter of Section five (5) Township three South of Range thirty eight East of Willamette Meridian in Union County Oregon, and makes and executes the hereto annexed corrected plat of said Addition for the purpose of correcting errors in the original plat of said Addition, and by these presents dedicates to the use of the Public forever all streets and alleys as shown by the said corrected plat. In witness whereof the said LaGrande Land Company has caused these presents to be signed by its President and Secretary and its Corporate Seal to be hereto affixed this 21st day of July A.D. 1890.

Streets running North and South are 80 feet wide, running East and West are 60 feet wide. All alleys are 16 feet wide, except on South of Blocks 24 + 25 which is 20 feet wide. All regular sized lots are 30 feet wide and 110 feet deep.
